

25 June	New study quantifies the effects of climate change in Europe
<p>If no further action is taken and global temperature increases by 3.5°C, climate damages in the EU could amount to at least €190 billion, a net welfare loss of 1.8% of its current GDP. Several weather-related extremes could roughly double their average frequency. As a consequence, heat-related deaths could reach about 200 000. These are just some of the findings of a new report by the JRC, which has analysed the impacts of climate change in 9 different sectors: agriculture, river floods, coasts, tourism, energy, droughts, forest fires, transport infrastructure and human health. The report also includes a pilot study on habitat suitability of forest tree species.</p>	
25 June	Scientific support to the Danube Strategy
<p>The JRC, together with the Austrian Federal Ministry of Science, Research and Economy, organised a high-level event dedicated to scientific support to the Danube Strategy. The event, opened, among others, by Vladimír Šucha, Director-General of the JRC and Barbara Weitgruber, Director-General of the Austrian Federal Ministry of Science, Research and Economy, has attracted 230 participants.</p>	
23 June	JRC at the 2014 Euroscience Open Forum (ESOF)
<p>Active player at ESOF since its first edition in 2004, this year the JRC organises six scientific sessions which illustrate the importance of science for policy and participates in other two. It also presents an exhibit entitled "Soil - the hidden treasure" within the "Science in the City" festival. The JRC's workshops and panels cover a variety of topics, including urbanisation in the 21st century, fiscal policy and economic growth, detection of food fraud, socio-economic issues and raw materials supply as well as the use of social incentives to encourage children to do more physical activity. With their focus on finding sustainable solutions that are useful to society and help to enhance economic growth, these JRC symposia attracted high level speakers from various organisations and academia worldwide.</p>	
18 June	Microalgae for food and feed markets, an opportunity for EU's bioeconomy
<p>The European Union has recently adopted an ambitious strategy for developing the Bioeconomy. In this context, microalgae represent an emerging biological resource of great importance for its potential applications in different fields, in particular as a new source of valuable nutrients for human and animal consumption. A new JRC report provides an in-depth review of microalgae production systems, markets, R&D developments and product pipeline, and unveils the experts' opinion on Europe's present and future challenges in the sector.</p>	
12 June	Chemical lists information system launched
<p>The JRC has launched an online tool to identify chemicals useful for the development and validation of alternative methods to animal testing. Individual chemicals are usually examined across many different research projects and are also regulated in various national or international programmes. Knowing which chemicals were looked at in a research project (e.g. a study on carcinogenic properties), and how they are treated from a legal point of view e.g. in Regulation on Registration, Evaluation, Authorisation and Restriction of Chemicals (REACH), gives a valuable insight into their possible role to calibrate, fine tune and assess an alternative method's potential to predict certain properties. The new JRC's Chemical Lists Information System (CheLIST) aims at providing this information.</p>	

11 June [Making diet count in cancer prevention](#)

Cancer risk factors can be reduced by correct nutrition and physical activity, which are key elements in all recommendations for cancer prevention, such as the European code against cancer. In a recently published report, JRC scientists screened the national cancer plans of all EU Members States plus Iceland, Norway, Switzerland and Turkey and checked how much attention was given to the dietary prevention of cancer. The analysis revealed that over 90% of the plans acknowledge a general link between nutrition and/or physical activity, and the potential positive impact that these can have in the prevention of various types of cancer.

10 June [Slovakia – tightening research cooperation](#)

The JRC and the Slovak Ministry of Education, Science, Research and Sport are hosting a high level conference discussing research cooperation between the JRC and Slovakia today in Bratislava, with the participation of Dušan Čaplovič, Slovak Minister of Education, Science, Research and Sport and Vladimír Šucha, JRC Director-General. The objective of the meeting is to strengthen cooperation in strategic areas which could bring added value to Slovak science as well as help integrate it even better within the European Research Area. The partners are additionally looking into areas where cooperation between the JRC and the Slovak Republic will be complementary to the objectives of the national strategy "Through knowledge towards prosperity - Research Innovation Strategy for Smart Specialisation of the Slovak Republic (RIS3 SK)".

5 June [World Environment Day - JRC expertise on circular economy](#)

Following the slogan of today's World Environment Day – Raise your voice not the sea level – the JRC has presented its activities on circular economy at the Green Week, the biggest annual conference on European environment policy which ends today. This year's Green Week theme is Circular Economy, Resource Efficiency & Waste. It reflects the need to re-use, re-manufacture and recycle goods in a world which is ever more resource-constrained. The JRC is active in several fronts in these areas: energy efficiency, renewable energy, natural resources protection and sustainable economy.

3 June [Interim storage of spent nuclear fuel: looking into the alterations](#)

A JRC co-authored study has examined the evolution of components of spent nuclear fuel by comparing actual spent fuel with lab results obtained on fuel analogues in simulated, accelerated timescale. Most of the trends observed were found to be comparable with characteristics of actual spent fuel. Ongoing programmes are also addressing the retrievability of spent fuel after extended storage and its behaviour under accident conditions. Such comparisons help make safety assessments of the alterations that occur in conditions of prolonged storage of spent fuel while waiting for its final disposal in a geological repository. The two most common types of spent nuclear fuel were examined: irradiated uranium dioxide (UO₂) and uranium (U) – plutonium (Pu) mixed oxide fuel (MOX).
